New! Union Chapel Book Group

In December Candy launched a church Book Group that meets weekly to discuss books about Christianity and other religions.

The first book selected is *No God but God*, by Reza Aslan, a Muslim scholar and sociologist who writes about the origins, evolution and complexity of the Muslim faith, one of the three great religions that trace their roots to Abraham. Aslan begins with a socio-economic description of the Arabian Peninsula at the beginning of the 7th Century, when Muhammad received his first revelations from God. Muhammad saw himself as a prophet in the line of Abraham, Moses, David and Jesus, receiving revelations from the same God as theirs. *No God but God* is no easy read, but it seems particularly important today to understand as much as we can about the Muslim faith, which has been claimed both by the protesters for democratic reform in the Arab Spring and by the Taliban and the jihadists of al-Qaeda and ISIS.

Since the members of the group, including Candy, have no special expertise in Islam, and we welcome any other seekers of truth in this murky area to join us in our journey of discovery.

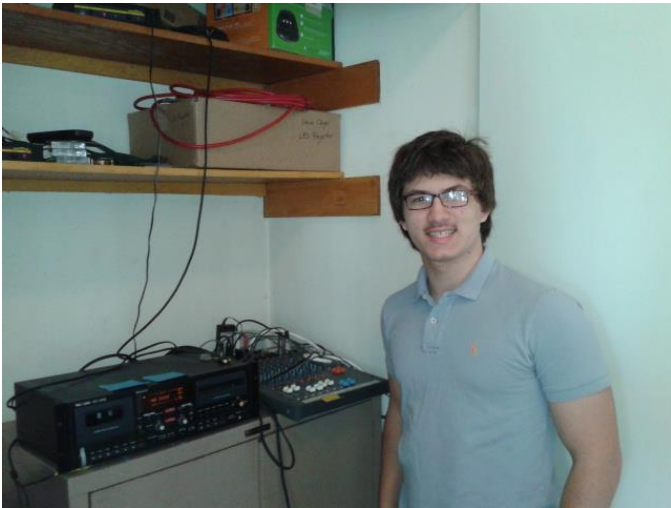

BIBLE QUESTIONS YOU ALWAYS WANTED TO ASK

What is the order in which the books of the New Testament were written, and should we consider this in judging their reliability?

Scholars find it difficult to pinpoint precise dates of origin, but there is general agreement that all 27 books in the New Testament were written between about 50–100 C.E. The earliest documents in this period were likely Paul’s letters to the churches around the Mediterranean (along with other letters), then the gospels and Acts, and then toward the end of the first century, Revelation.

On the question of reliability (which itself could mean different things), it is thought that the gospels were circulated orally long before they were written down, and also that it is quite possible that stories about Jesus were circulated even during his lifetime. In other words, the gospels were not written from distant memories but based on existing material. Another factor to consider is that the first churches by necessity needed to determine the validity of the letters and gospels they read on Sundays, and during the second century had selected as authoritative a set of writings very close to the New Testament we read today.

This is a very quick look at a deep and worthwhile subject!

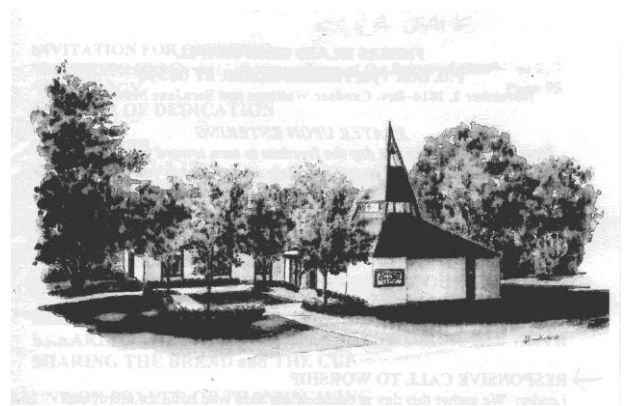
Do you know what God looks like?
