Because of safety issues and the environment, the Thrift Shop cannot accept donations of *air conditioners, auto parts, bathroom/kitchen fixtures, children's items(i.e. high chairs, cribs, car seats, strollers, play pens), CRT (tube) TVs, flammable materials, furniture that is heavily soiled/broken/ripped, guns and ammunition, halogen lamps, hazardous chemicals, large appliances, mattresses and box springs, nonworking small appliances, exercise equipment, paints, and wet or heavily soiled textiles.*

Dear Fishers Island Friends,

I hope this finds you enjoying the waning rhythms of summer and the early hints of fall as we cross over into that lovely season. Much has ensued since my last update. Many of you are aware that God blessed me with my graduation from Eden Theological Seminary in May, 2015 with my Master in Divinity Degree. Since then, I was able to complete a Sabbatical coverage at Venice UCC last summer and a residency as a chaplain at St. Francis Hospital in Hartford. In May I completed my Ecclesiastical Council with the New London Association, which endorsed me with "approved for ordination pending call" with our beloved Rev. Candace Whitman at my side, who blessed me with her presence and wisdom through this final stage.

I am humbly grateful to say I am writing this note from my office at The First Congregational Church of South Windsor, CT, where I am now serving as their Designated Pastor. HOLY COW! Our leadership is on the move again...

With summer in full swing, Union Chapel launched a church-wide survey in order to learn the opinions of our congregation about our church life. By conducting the survey in August we were able to glean information from both our summer and year-round congregations, and have a basis for planning at the fall meeting of church leadership.

The survey, created by Holy Cow Consultants, touched on a range of topics – our worship, outreach, our thoughts on scripture, for example - and was geared for smaller churches. Rev. Dr. Tom Clough, our Eastern




Regional Minister of the Connecticut Conference of the UCC, is a certified interpreter of the surveys, and so Tom came the Sunday after the results were in to preach and to meet with our Trustees and Deacons to discuss the findings.

Survey Highlights

Tom reviewed what respondents said, and provided the following summary for us:

- 1. We are "highly satisfied" with, and have "high energy" for, the ministry of the church.
- 2. We are "progressive" theologically, which means we are liberal in our thinking about Christianity.
- 3. We are very happy with our worship services.
- 4. One area to look at is how well we apply faith to our everyday lives. We scored low on these questions, but Tom added that we are on par with New England churches!



Where do we go from here?

Strong approval ratings, according to Tom, indicate that we are stewards of a great gift and we need to see it as a responsibility to do more.

If you attend church here regularly and would like to be part of the conversation about new directions or places for us to focus as a church, you are warmly welcomed to attend our leadership gathering on September 19. Please just let Candy know to expect you.

Tom added that he often does not see such positive survey results. And so we have much to be grateful for! I look forward to our continued work together under God's guidance for how we can fulfill our mission to serve God in this place and time. - Candy
