Dear Friends,

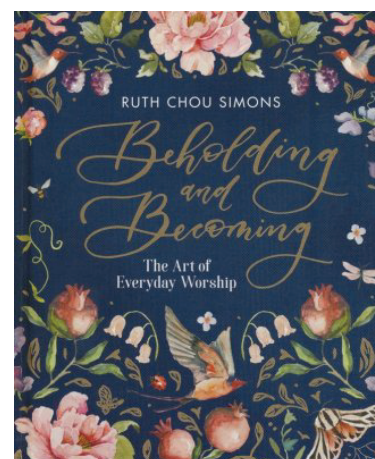

WHY WE LOVE BEACH CHURCH BY TRUSTEE GREG LANG



Grace and I, and our children, Diane and Calvin, love Fishers Island Union Chapel beach church and have been attending at Dock Beach early most summer Sunday mornings when we rent on Fishers. We are relative newcomers as summer residents of Fishers and spend our “regular lives” in New York City, where we attend an indoor church. I will give a few of the reasons to love the Union Chapel Beach Church service in the hope of convincing you to join us in this wonderful Fishers Island institution.

- 1. Beach Church is brief.** At 30 minutes or less, you will begin your Sunday with a recharge of nature, contemplation and community while leaving the entire remainder of your Sunday to commune with Creation on the golf course, tennis court, at Chocomount, carousing with friends, etc. Grace and I both work in New York City during the week, so although it may seem sacrilegious, we prize the brevity of the service and the fact that it is early in the day.
- 2. Beach Church is welcoming and ecumenical.** Over the years at Beach Church we have met longtime Fishers people, both summer and year-rounders. We have met people just passing through, people on-island to work or on-island visiting friends. We have met very traditional Christian believers who are regular church-goers, lapsed or occasional church-goers, people looking for community, Jewish folks and at least one Deist. A big turnout for Beach Church is 20 people or so. The small size of the group means if you are new to Fishers or to Beach Church, you may meet someone you have never met before. If you are a longtime Fishers person, you may see someone you haven't seen in awhile.
- 3. Pastor Rosanna will make you think.** Given the brevity of the service, Pastor Rosanna's message is brief, too. Though Beach Church is brief, Pastor Rosanna's messages are pithy and meaningful. Last Summer, she spent a series of Beach Church

services reading short passages from the nature journals of Jonathan Edwards. Many of you will know Edwards as the fire-and-brimstone American preacher of the 1700s. Pastor Rosanna explored the less-known, more sensitive, open and universalist side of this familiar historical figure through words recorded during his own nature walks 300 years ago. Pastor Rosanna is a scholar not only of the church but of wide-ranging subjects, and will appeal to people, like us, who appreciate a well-researched, intellectually curious message.

- 4. Community.** Most readers will already know that Fishers Island is one of the most hospitable places you can ever hope to find. Beach Church reflects this. A small group of regulars at the service may change a little, week to week, and is almost always joined by a few new people visiting Fishers or joining friends at the service. Many churches post signs or begin services with “All are welcome” and this has never been said more truly than at Union Chapel's beach church. You will have at least one real conversation before, after or even during the very informal service. If you are intimidated by church, this will be the least intimidating church you can imagine. If you have attended an indoor church every Sunday of your life, this will mark a new, wonderful level of informality.

Laura Chapman is the new Union Chapel Sexton. She will help with the management of all maintenance and improvements being performed at our Chapel, Parsonage, and Thrift Shop. While working full time, Laura earned her

BSBA from Hawaii Pacific University. Laura and Michael are very proud of their two sons. Christopher (28) is a Chemist; Spencer (25) is a Data Engineer. The boys cherished spending their summers here with their cousins from Texas (the Mannetti's), and still look forward to connecting with them every summer. After over 30 years in the contracting field, Laura retired as Supervisory Contract Specialist/Contracting Officer with the Department of the Navy. She was responsible for soliciting, awarding, and administering a variety of contracts to include submarine repairs and modernization, architect-engineering services, military construction, and all types of facilities maintenance. WHY WE LOVE BEACH CHURCH

41° 15' 43" N, 72° 0' 26" W. I don't know what prompted the Creator of the Universe to make the island at these coordinates so special. But if you are here on a summer Sunday morning, why not be down at Dock Beach? The shallow water and sandy bottom of West Harbor along the western shore of the harbor out toward Hawk's Nest Point create a color to the water that you don't see often. During service, the ospreys will be in their nest out there near the point, or commuting across the harbor on their various errands. Birds will alight on the reeds along the back of the beach or on the lifeguard stand. During service a duck will swim by. The IODs at their moorings and the water around them will glitter in the morning sun. A wake from out in the channel will send little waves onto the beach or a little motorboat will putter by. A few feet from the gathered group, a kid who couldn't wait to get to the beach may splash along in the shallows. Significant portions of the Beach Church service are dedicated to moments of quiet reflection, and during these moments, the awesome reality of God's creation at these particular coordinates comes rushing in.
